Student Characteristics and Achievement in 22 KIPP (Knowledge Is Power Program) Middle Schools is a new report from Mathematica about charter schools nationwide. The report shows that after three years, middle school student gains in math are large enough in half the schools to significantly narrow race- and income-based achievement gaps among students.

A recent brief from MDRC gives interim results from an evaluation of the National Guard Youth ChalleNGe Program, which aims to "reclaim" the lives of high school dropouts. ChalleNGe—which requires no military service—is a residential program operating in more than half the nation's states, with more than 90,000 completing it since its launch in the 1990s.
