Local favorite restaurants include The Chalet in The Valley (Swiss cuisine) in Charm, Ohio (3 mi. away); Boyd & Wurthmans (Amish cuisine and baked goods) in downtown Berlin, and Der Dutchman (Amish cuisine and baked goods) in Walnut Creek, Ohio (6 mi. away).

DIRECTIONS: The Berlin Resort is located one mile west of Berlin, Ohio on the corner of State Route 39 and Holmes County Road 201. State Route 39 crosses Ohio from east to west and may be accessed from Interstates 77 and 71 from both the north and south. The closest airport is the Akron Canton Regional Airport (CAK) and is approximately a 1 hour drive from the conference site.
